

## rvaMORE Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

Purpose of Meeting: Regular board meeting - see attached agenda.

Greg called the meeting to order just after 6 p.m.

### **TRAVIS/FINANCIALS**

The board welcomed our new Treasurer, Travis Guilbeau to the club and his first board meeting. Travis was nominated to the board in May 2016 to take the reins from Bruce Swanson, who expressed his desire to retire from the board after years of service. We thank Bruce for his dedication to the club over the years and wish him well!

Travis has reviewed the club's past financials back to 2010 (which gives us 5 years of solid financial data) and reformatted and recategorized so we have a better understanding of revenue streams, expenses and overhead. Over half of the club's revenue is generated from cash donations, grants, ticket sales, asset sales and revenue sharing. 2% comes from direct membership. We spend the majority of our funds on tools with vendor costs coming in second place.

We currently have \$20,900 in available funds not allocated to any specific project.

#### Poop Loop

You may have noticed some heavily armored sections on the Poop Loop. The park used part of the grant money it received from REI to purchase stone in fill in those areas that are prone to flooding. There are many additional areas to work on and Mike expects that Poop Loop maintenance will last for much of the winter. Look for trail work days to be posted throughout the winter. The park is still on board with making the Poop Loop directional which would alternate based on the day and also possibly moving the entrance to the Loop closer to the end of the Poop Shoot so riders would not have to contend with the pipe line section which gets super muddy as well.

#### Gillies Dirt Jumps

The Gillies jump park is planning to add a beginner/intermediate jump line to make those features more progressive in nature. The cost to cover an assessment of the area is \$2,750. A motion was made for the club to cover the assessment cost which was approved.

#### Belle Island – Large Rollers

It was determined that the large rollers at the skills park are a little too advanced for that area and will be replaced with smaller and shallower rollers at no cost to the club.

### Deep Run

Two more board walks are going to be installed in Deep Run Park and the county is buying the materials for the project. We need to add trail work days to our schedule to make this happen. In addition, some needed rock armoring will take place which will be handled by the Boy Scouts.

Pump Track at Deep Run? A local cyclist has expressed interest in making this happen. This would be a great resource for riders in Henrico County. More details to come.

Greg and Clark are interested in attending the IMBA summit in Bentonville, Arkansas in November. They have attended this event in the past and have returned with valuable information through the summit's educational and speaker sessions. Greg and Clark asked if the board would be willing to allocate approximately \$2,000 to assist with their expenses (fees, lodging, gas). The board approved this request.

### New Board Nominees

Greg announced the new nominees to serve on the board for the 2017 term. New nominees are Will McQuate, Kendell Ryan and Marysa Burchett. Marysa would also be serving as Secretary in place of Lisa Lambrecht who will be resigning from her Secretary position at the end of 2016.

All were in favor. We are looking forward to welcoming these new members to the board!
